SMRP Establishes New Chapter in Indiana

Two committees were formed. A Steering Committee worked on the requirements for chapter formation, while a Content Committee identified ideas for future meetings, including approaches for sharing best practices among our members. The committees (which formed the Steering Committee, and ultimately the first Board of Directors) worked from June to September 2006 to get all Chapter pre-requisites completed, as well as establishing proposed work shops and tours for the first few meetings.

In addition to enjoying a congratulatory dinner provided by SMRP, the attendees completed membership applications and a survey for chapter content and meeting activities. Tom Brink, past Chairman of the SMRP, was on hand to congratulate the group for having achieved this milestone. Mr. Haverly later commented: "We have a great start on our finances and everyone is working hard on assignments / committees, future plans, website, survey, applications, contact lists, etc. You can be proud of your efforts."
